## **Building Committee Updates**

Over the past month, the building committee has been working with Jim Sampey of Sampey Associates Architects to develop the architectural master plans. Through discussions and meetings, it was determined to update Phase 1 drawings that were completed a few years ago to include both a kitchen and a fellowship hall.

On November 14th, the building committee met with Mr. Sampey to work through these redesigned plans. Once completed and approved, the plans will be further developed into schematic plans. These are more detailed plans which would then be used to create the actual construction plans.

In order for the schematic drawings to be completed, additional survey work and geo-technical testing will need to be completed in the near future.


